The Academia Interamericana de Panama is a The AIP calculates GPA on a 5-point scale, private, co-ed, Catholic, bilingual school for students from Pre-School through Grade 12. With an emphasis on strong moral values, those at AIP strive to create an environment where respect and support enable each student to thrive and reach their academic potential.

AIP is fully accredited by the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Panama and not only meets the educational requirements of Panama, but also endeavors to thoroughly prepare students for successful study abroad. Beginning in Pre-School, both English and Spanish are taught as first languages. Emphasis is placed on the importance of being able to communicate well in both languages. The Mathematics and Science programs are also strong, resulting in a curriculum that is extremely demanding.

## **MATH & PHYSICS OLYMPICS**

AIP students take a series of tests in order to qualify for the Math Olympics team. Based on the test results, the top twelve students from ninth through twelfth grades make up the team.

Students participate in a similar competition in the area of physics.

## **DEBATE**

Following a process of instruction and coaching, delegates are chosen to represent the school in Hacia Democracy, a Harvard University sponsored debate involving Latin American High School students and focused on social issues. They also participate in other forums to which they are invited.

## **THEATER**

The AIP Parent-Teacher Association sponsors a musical theater production each year. Professional artists are involved in choosing cast members. The Director, Musical Director and the Producer are proven professionals so that rehearsals are strenuous and demanding.

## **ATHLETICS**

Competition in sports is encouraged. Students compete in basketball, football, soccer, volleyball, and track at both intramural and intermural levels and have won national awards in these sports.
